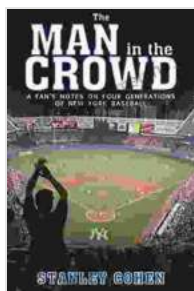


# Fan Notes On Four Generations Of New York Baseball

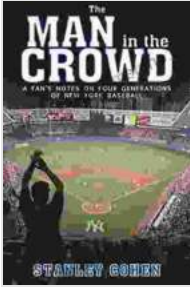
